## Year 11 Exams Information

### Y11 Summer 2024 Exam Timetables

Year 11 students have been given their individual summer examination timetables for final checking. These timetables do not include the practical exams which are taking place in subjects such as French/German (speaking exams) and Art, Photography, PE (practical exams) for example.

**IMPORTANT!** All Y11 students must now:

- **Check the correct spelling of their name on their timetable** (this is the name that will appear on exam certificates in the summer)
- **Check that the tier is correct (foundation/higher)** for maths, science and languages.
- **Check that all the subjects you are studying are listed** - is there anything missing?
- **Report any issues, corrections and amendments by email as soon as possible, but definitely before March 28th to:** [exams@saddleworthschool.org](mailto:exams@saddleworthschool.org)

**Clashes:** Some students may notice that they have a morning or afternoon where they have more than one exam – this is a clash. Where clashes occur, the school has to follow the JCQ guidelines and is currently making arrangements for any exam clashes so that students who need to, can take them all their exams on the same day. As soon as the clash arrangements have been finalised, they will be shared with students.
