# **Outdoor Table Tennis Lunchtime Club**







It has been a very busy and exciting time for our talented year 7 musicians – this term has been jam packed with ensemble rehearsals, instrumental / vocal lessons, plus GCSE performance exams and ABRSM / Trinity grade examinations taking place as we head towards the Easter break. It has been wonderful to see our musicians flourish at this time – lots and lots of hard work on display from students in every year group.

#### **Global Grooves**

The music department were delighted to invite Global Grooves into school to hold Carnival music works - I have wanted to host this type of performance workshop for some time, to give our talented young musicians a glimpse into different types of music making. The workshops featured key stage 3 students from years 7, 8 and 9 engaging in Latin American percussion workshops and brass improvisation sessions, before combining the two elements to create a huge live Carnival style improvised performance. Grooves, newly composed themes and individual improvisations from every student participating made the final performances very exciting I'm amazed how such a tight performance was brought together after such a short time of working on creating a piece of music, students having the opportunity to explore this musical genre had a challenging and exciting time and enjoyed creating music in a different way to what they are mostly used to in ensembles they perform with outside school.

### Year 7 in Hallé Heaven

Following the success of our recent Hallé Orchestra 'Adopt-a-player' showcase concert at Saddleworth School in January the Year 7 Band were invited to watch a further Hallé Orchestra performance at the stunning Bridgewater Hall in Manchester.

On this visit the orchestra performed another breathtaking programme that challenged our young musicians a little more in terms of content. The orchestra opened their programme with the image conjuring 'Four Sea Interludes' from the opera Peter Grimes by British composer Benjamin Britten in 1945. Music to describe the breaking of dawn and the crashing of stormy waves – very dramatic. The four movements 'Dawn', 'Sunday Morning', 'Moonlight' and 'Storm' all create tremendous atmosphere as they take the listener from one location to another, taking inspiration from the original opera's plot. A very dramatic and brilliantly played opening to preceding's under the direction of today's guest maestro; Estonian, Kristiina Poska.

Next up our year 7 musicians were absolutely treated to a virtuosic performance by young Cumbrian Saxophone star Jess Gillam. Jess performed the work 'Briggflatts' written by another English Saxophone supremo, John Harle. The three-movement concerto for Soprano Saxophone is based on the poem 'Briggflatts' by Basil Bunting. Steeped in all things Cumbrian the music is expansive, dramatic, reflective, demanding and thought provoking - the final movement 'RANT' is based on toe-tapping Cumbrian folk tunes. As expected, the performance was absolutely electrifying from soloist and orchestra – we were gifted front row seats for the performance, so our aspect for the performance gave us an incredible position to watch Jess Gillam's artistry at work, each and every one of us were blown away by the extremely high quality of performance given – BRAVO JESS GILLAM, you have gained a dozen new super fans!

Interval ice cream of choice... strawberry cheesecake! Verdict – 5 stars!

The second half of the concert saw the Hallé tackle the challenging 1st Symphony by Finnish composer Jean Sibelius. This was the first time our year 7 students had listened to an entire symphony in one sitting – a challenge and demanding experience for musicians so young.

"Written in 1899 Sibelius' work represented a protest against Tsar Nicholas II's recent curtailing of constitutional rights in Finland, a putatively autonomous Grand Duchy of the Russian Empire, which was becoming increasingly restive under the harsh rule of its Russian governors. "The first symphony was mainly about Sibelius getting to grips with the heritage of the late Romantic symphony. The first symphony is the energetic music of a young man. The young Sibelius was no wimp; the music contains the whole wildness and rage of the man."

Powerful and challenging listening for sure, our wonderful band thoroughly enjoyed the music and were able to appreciate the technical aspects of the music performed superbly by the Hallé Orchestra – we are so very lucky to have this world class ensemble so close to our doorstep.

It was an extra nice opportunity to catch up with music department friend Ewan Easton MBE. Ewan is the tuba player with the Hallé and is an incredibly inspiring musician who is always there to guide young musicians to succeed, develop and progress in their performing endeavours. It's always wonderful talking to Ewan, he always inspires me personally and makes our students feel ten feet tall when we visit the Bridgewater Hall. A huge thank you to Naomi Benn (Head of Hallé Connect) and Clare Webster (Education and Outreach manager) for making this special opportunity a reality. We look forward to visiting the Hallé again in the not-too-distant future! Please visit www.halle.co.uk for more information about this wonderful orchestra and the concerts they are hosting in Manchester – treat yourself, go and listen - you will not be disappointed!
